  - Math Course Updates
    - Addition of Introduction to Statistics & Calculus for Business
    - Mr. Owens also discussed the need to review our courses/titles to ensure that we are supporting students with necessary prerequisites as they begin their college coursework.

    - PHS will no longer offer Physical Science
  - Fine Arts Updates/Title Changes
    - Ceramics I (previously known as Intro to Ceramics)
    - Ceramics II (previously known as Advanced Ceramics)
    - Drawing I (previously known as Intro to Drawing)

## Dual Credit/College Credit Offerings

- JJC is implementing a program titled 12x12x12; providing the opportunity for students to graduate high school with 12 college credits for only \$12 per credit.
  - We hope to examine this offering and see how we can properly train our staff to possibly implement these opportunities for the 2024-2025 school year.
- ONU has also reached out regarding providing opportunities for students to take summer courses or for Early Release students to take fall courses.
  - We are in the process of distributing that paperwork now. Courses are \$125 per credit hour.
