RE: <u>ACTION REPORT</u> – PHS Course Guide Changes 2023-24

Over the last two weeks, I met with the administration, the Guidance Department, and each curricular department at PHS to review current course offerings and proposed revisions for the next school year. The recommended course guide changes from those meetings are outlined below. All course proposals are contingent on student interest and enrollment numbers.

NEW COURSE PROPOSALS:

AGRICULTURE, FOODS, & NATURAL RESOURCES COURSES

Introduction to Ag & Foods (Formerly Known as Introduction to the Agriculture Industry)
Grade: 9-10 2 Sem. 1 Credit Prereq: None

This orientation course provides an opportunity for students to learn how the agricultural industry is organized; its major components; the economic influence of agriculture at state, national and international levels; and the scope and types of job opportunities in many agricultural fields. Other industry concepts include: plant/animal/food science, workplace skills, public speaking, life skills and parliamentary procedures. Participation in FFA student organization activities and Supervised Agricultural Experience (SAE) projects are an integral course component for leadership development, career exploration and reinforcement of academic concepts.

Veterinary Science

Grade: 11-12 2 Sem. 1 Credit Prereq: Must have taken Animal/Plant Science before taking this or otherwise approved by the teacher.

Course Description: This course will develop students' understanding of the small and companion animal industry, animal anatomy and physiology, advanced animal nutrition and reproduction, animal ethics and welfare issues, animal health, veterinary medicine, veterinary office practices, and animal services to humans. Career exploration will focus on veterinarian, veterinary lab technicians, office lab assistant, small animal production, research lab assistant, and animal nutrition lab technician. Students will participate in activities such as animal bandaging, specimen dissection, animal handling and animal restraint (for veterinary purposes). Participation in FFA student organization activities and Supervised Agricultural Experience (SAE) projects is an integral course component for leadership development, career exploration and reinforcement of academic concepts.



Ag Construction - Textiles I (Previously Known as Clothing/Sewing)

Grade: 9-12

1 Sem. 1/2 Credit

Prereq: None

This semester course will introduce the student to basic concepts of clothing construction skills and related careers. The course will also focus on how products are produced and made into objects that we use for clothing and sewing purposes. Topics include: the basic textiles, history of fashion, communicating through clothes and decision-making skills. Construction units begin with using the sewing/Cricut machine and understanding fabric. Students will construct several major projects which utilize basic sewing/Cricut skills on woven materials and knits. Students provide their own supplies and must complete all construction work at school. When sewing for community service is required, supplies will be provided by the teacher. Participation in FFA student organization activities and Supervised Agricultural Experience (SAE) projects are an integral course component for leadership development, career exploration and reinforcement of academic concepts.

Ag Construction - Textiles II (Previously Known as Clothing & Textiles II)

Grade: 10-12

1 Sem. 0.5 Credit

Prereq: Clothing & Textiles I with a "C" or higher

This class will act as a continuation to Ag Construction- Textiles 1 in the basic understanding of products and how to construct them into items we use. Students will gain many construction skills in this course. In addition to regular sewing machines and the Cricut machine, an embroidery machine will be used. Students will complete several major projects as well as some smaller ones which may be donated as community service projects. Students provide their own supplies (teacher provides community service supplies) and must complete all construction work at school. Participation in FFA student organization activities and Supervised Agricultural Experience (SAE) projects are an integral course component for leadership development, career exploration and reinforcement of academic concepts.

Farm to Fork I (Previously Known as Foods I)

Grade: 9-12

1 Sem. 1/2 Credit

Prereq: Intro to Ag & Foods

Want to learn where your food comes from and how to prepare it? This course allows you to learn the agricultural origins of your food, how to prepare it accurately and safely, and how to make sound consumer, economic and nutritional decisions. Use our food science lab to make foods including Garden Veggies, Apples, Pumpkins, Eggs, Cookies. Participation in FFA student organization activities and Supervised Agricultural Experience (SAE) projects are an integral course component for leadership development, career exploration and reinforcement of academic concepts.

Farm to Fork II (Previously Known as Foods II)

Grade: 9-12

1 Sem. 1/2 Credit

Prereq: Farm to Fork I

Want to learn where your food comes from and how to prepare it? This course allows you to learn the agricultural origins of your food, how to prepare it accurately and safely, and how to make sound consumer, economic and nutritional decisions. Poultry, Salads, Casseroles and Sugar/Desserts. Also learn about food labels, nutrition, and food budgeting. Participation in FFA student organization activities and Supervised Agricultural Experience (SAE) projects are an integral course component for leadership development, career exploration, and reinforcement of academic concepts.



Global Foods & Ag (Previously Known as International Foods)

Grade: 10-12 1 Sem. 1/2 Credit Prereq- Must have taken Farm to Fork I & II

This course involves preparing and serving food from around the world. Emphasis will be placed on considering nutritional requirements, demographic factors, and religious customs as they pertain to foods served in the countries of study. This course will also focus on agriculture in developing countries and frame this focus within a discussion of contemporary crucial issues facing food, agriculture, and natural resources on a global scale. The course will look at the impacts of geographic, political, economic, and social issues of a particular country or region and how that affects their agriculture and trade. International influences upon regions of the United States will be investigated. Participation in FFA student organization activities and Supervised Agricultural Experience (SAE) projects are an integral course component for leadership development, career exploration and reinforcement of academic concepts.

Foundations in Foods

Grade- 9-12 2 Sem. 1 Credit

Prereq-None

This course is designed to teach students basic kitchen skills throughout their high school experience. In this recurring class students will have the opportunity to revisit concepts every year including measuring, knives, conversions, food prep, baking, cooking, grocery shopping, table setting, cleaning, and organizing kitchen spaces.

MATH COURSES

Introduction to Statistics

Grade: 11-12

2 Sem. 1 Credit

Prereq: Informal Algebra II or Algebra II, Honors Algebra II

Introduction to Statistics presents the study of likely events and the analysis, interpretation, and presentation of quantitative data. Course topics generally include basic probability and statistics; discrete probability theory, odds and probabilities, probability trees, populations and samples, frequency tables, measures of central tendency, and presentation of data (including graphs). Course topics may also include normal distribution and measures of variability.

Calculus for Business

Grade: 12

1 Sem. 0.5 Credit

Prereq: Honors Algebra II, Honors Precalculus, Precalculus, Concurrent enrollment in Algebra II with

teacher recommendation

Calculus for Business is a calculus course for those students interested in business, economics, or other business-related fields. The course will use applications of the business world through functions, graphs, limits, exponential and logarithmic functions, differentiation, integration, partial derivatives, and optimization. The use of business technologies, including Google Suite and online graphing utilities are incorporated to expand understanding. College equivalent work is expected from all students.



Probability

Grade: 12

1 Sem. 0.5 Credit

Prereq: Calculus for Business

Probability is an expansion and the continuation of the content learned from Calculus for Business. This course covers permutations and combinations, set theory, functions, discrete and continuous sample spaces, probability functions, conditional probability, independent events, probability distribution functions for discrete random variables, cumulative probability, probability density functions, and joint probability. College equivalent work is expected from all students.

SCIENCE COURSE

Honors Chemistry I

Grade: 10

2 Sem. 1 Credit

Prereq: Honors Biology I with a "C" or higher and concurrent enrollment in Honors Algebra II or concurrent enrollment in Algebra II with teacher recommendation

Honors Chemistry is an advanced laboratory-based science class designed for college-bound students and to prepare students to take AP science classes in the future. Areas discussed include chemical foundations; stoichiometry; atomic structure and properties; molecular and ionic compound structure and properties; chemical reactions; kinetics; thermodynamics; equilibrium; acids and bases; application of thermochemistry.

CURRENT COURSE CHANGES:

ENGLISH COURSE

Creative Writing Prerequisite Change

The only prerequisite for **Creative Writing** was **English II**. Due to the multitude of writing and the expectations of the course, the prerequisites for **Creative Writing** will be changed to the following: English II w/a "B" or higher



FINE ARTS COURSES

ART COURSES

Four courses will have title changes in 2023-2024; however, no changes will be made to the course descriptions:

- Ceramics I will now be called Intro to Ceramics
- **Ceramics II** will be changed to **Advanced Ceramics**



The Esports team would also aim to participate in IHSA E-Sports competitions. During the 2021-2022 school year, IHSA started an official E-Sports program, which includes Super Smash Brothers Ultimate, Rocket League, and NBA2k. Even if an official IHSA team is unable to be formed for the 2022-2023 school year, having the activity as a club would offer a valuable social opportunity that is currently lacking at PHS.
Grades of Students Involved:	Participation in E-Sports would be for 9th - 12th grade students enrolled in PHS (including out-of-district placed students who are eligible to participate in PHS sports and activities).
Student Contact (please be specific; how often you will meet with students; when will you be meeting; time frames, etc.):	I am currently envisioning official E-sports team practices 4 days per week during the season, with two days devoted to Rocket League and two days devoted to Super Smash Brothers Ultimate. Depending on student interest and sponsor/coach availability, a fifth day (every other week) may also be beneficial as a club day for students who are interested but who may not want to compete in formal competition. Practices would be after school in a designated classroom, running from 3:15 to 4:45p
Proposed Budget:	Approximately \$1100 for supplies This would go towards the following: Nintendo Switch Console x2 (\$300 each) Nintendo Switch Controller x4 (~\$50 each) Super Smash Brothers Ultimate Game x2 (\$60 each) Super Smash Brothers Fighter Pass x2 (\$30 each) Rocket League x2 (Free to Download) Nintendo Switch Online Membership x2 (\$35 each/year)
Any Additional Comments:	As I have stated, I would like for the team to participate in the IHSA Esports program. Even if that is not possible, I think it would be beneficial to have a gaming club in place for students to join. One major benefit of IHSA E-Sports would be the inclusion of academic eligibility requirements for students to participate, thereby providing some non-athletic students an incentive to keep their grades up.

One benefit to the proposed budget is that several of the items are one-time purchases that should last PHS several years. Subsequent years' would likely require less monetary investment (unless new games are added or if we want to expand the number of systems available).

The proposed budget assumes that projectors or televisions already available at PHS can be used instead of needing to acquire new ones.

All systems would be locked in a secure location outside of practice times.

If the team participates in IHSA, the sponsors/coaches may seek a coaching stipend, which is not currently factored into the proposed budget.

12/9/22 Update: Students meet to play Super Smash Brothers and MarioKart on the Nintendo Switch systems every Wednesday and then, every other Wednesday, students who are interested in Rocket League meet to play. Going into next semester, we are looking into setting up matches with other schools to play against a wider range of ability levels. Furthermore, several students have expressed interest in competing in the IHSA E-Sports sectionals tournament in April. Once we get students registered, we would like to increase the frequency of practices leading up to sectionals and (potentially) state competitions.

Looking to the future, we would like to continue to expand the E-sports program to explore additional games and to accommodate more participants. Furthermore, there are a variety of organizations partnering with IHSA (such as PlayVS) which offer Fall and Spring seasons for students to compete more regularly against other schools. E-Sports is a growing interest at both collegiate and high school levels and we are excited to be able to help Peotone establish a program early in the process.

As a result of the time and equipment already invested, PHS is asking the BOE to support a \$550.06 stipend for the 22-23 SY for the time dedicated to the club up to this point in addition to the IHSA Spring E-Sports Season.

Any Additional Comments:	Most schools in the area have long standing and successful Art Clubs, and I believe it is time to give PHS students the opportunity to have an Art Club of their own. Giving all students, including those who are not in any other extracurriculars, an organization to be part of can lead to great personal growth. The ability to meet like minded peers in a controlled setting will be great for their growth as artists, teach them about leadership and responsibility, as well as give them a good social outlet. There are currently approximately 25 students, all 9th-11th grade, who plan to be part of the club, and I anticipate this number will increase next year with the incoming Freshman class. 12/9/22 Update: After implementing this club at the end of the 21-22 school year they are up to 31 students in their membership. The Art Club met 12 times from March

2021 through May of 2021 for a total of 12 hours. They have also volunteered for Face Painting during Christmas in the Village as well as at Peotone Elementary School.

During the 22-23 SY the Art Club meets 2-3 times per month in addition to some meetings on the weekends. They are again volunteering their time for Christmas in the Village and at Peotone Elementary School and they have taken on several community projects since its inception including donating their time to the Peotone Park District's Girls Trailblazers Group and have purchased supplies to make Christmas Ornaments.

Other stipend amounts offered by conference schools include \$0, \$760, \$886, and \$900 annually with new clubs and \$2,300 and \$1,665 annually in schools where the sponsors have earned longevity pay.

Their future aspirations are to host a local Art Show at PHS and also working with the Peotone Park District again by painting themes on the benches in the park.

PHS is recommending a beginning stipend in the amount of \$1,128.85 for the 22-23 SY for the time dedicated to the club up to this point. This would be equivalent to the Math Club Stipend.
