ADMINISTRATIVE REPORTS:

Mr. Steve Stein, Superintendent, reported to the Board that he received a couple of FOIA requests since our last board meeting. One FOIA request was from the Illinois Retired Teachers, which is an annual request that we receive, inquiring about retiring certified teachers of the District. Mr. Stein has complied with this request. The second FOIA request was from Smart Local 265 asking about any potential construction or maintenance projects of the District. Mr. Stein worked with Mr. Crawford to complete this FOIA request. Mr. Stein also wanted to take a moment to read a brief statement from Andrew Pittenger, Principal from Dwight Township High School who asked Mr. Stein if he could please publically thank Mr. Spang and Mrs. Upton for welcoming a Dwight Township high school English teacher into Mrs. Upton's class for two days of observations and collaboration. Mr. Pittenger stated that it was a great experience for the teacher and Mr. Pittenger was very thankful to us for letting one of his teachers have this opportunity at Peotone High School.

Mr. Brandon Owens, Director of Curriculum and Instruction, reported to the Board that the Peotone Educational Foundation held its annual Bowlarama at the Peotone Bowling Alley this past Friday, March 10th. It was another well-attended and fun event for all. I'd like to thank the Ed Foundation members for planning and running the event, which included basket raffles and split-the-pot. After Spring Break, our 3rd-8th grade students will be participating in the Illinois Assessment of Readiness. Right now, we are in the process of preparing the sessions and getting tickets ready to print.

Another assessment that our 5th, 8th, 11th grade students will be taking is the Illinois Science Assessment. Our 11th grade students took the 3-unit assessment last week; they are in the process of completing a few remaining makeups. Our 5th and 8th grade will be taking these assessments after completing the IAR in mid-to-late April.
