

ADMINISTRATIVE REPORTS:

Mr. Steve Stein, Superintendent, reported to the Board that he has received several FOIAs this month, one from Christy Miller regarding COVID numbers in January. Mr. Stein received three FOIAs from John Maxedon, one for enrollment from FY16 to the present, emails between Mr. Stein and Mrs. Robinson from November, and utility costs from FY16 to the present. E-Learning Day - Update

At the beginning of this school year, Peotone CUSD 207U created an e-Learning Day/Remote Learning Plan, which was approved by the Illinois State Board of Education. Illinois schools with an approved e-Learning Plan have the ability to utilize e-Learning Days in lieu of emergency days; however, ISBE states that "the number of e-Learning Days may not exceed the number of emergency days in the approved school calendar. ISBE's statement means that approved Illinois Schools are only granted up to five (5) e-Learning Days per school year. On Friday, February 18th, Peotone CUSD 207U utilized its fifth and final e-Learning Day for the 2021-22 school year. If any additional school closures are required due to weather conditions or other emergencies, we will utilize a traditional snow/emergency day and make those days up by adding them to the end of the school calendar.
